The first mobile phone call was made on 3 April 1973. It was made by a man named Martin Cooper, who worked for Motorola, the makers of the mobile phone. He phoned Dr Joel S. Engel, who worked for a different phone company, and told him he was talking on a mobile phone.

The phone looked a bit different to today's phones. It weighed 1.1 kilos and was nearly twenty-three centimetres long. The phone was never sold to the public, but ten years later Motorola made the DynaTAC 8000X, which they sold for \$3995!

More and more mobile phones are sold every year, and in 2014 newspapers reported that there were now more mobile devices than people in the world!
